DIGEST: This bill updates various sections of the Business and Professions Code (BPC) in order to reflect the name changes of programs.

ANALYSIS:

Existing law:

- Specifies that a number of programs within the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) have a term of office for any member for four years, expiring June 1 of that year (BPC § 130) and specifies that a number of programs within the DCA require an applicant to supply a full set of fingerprints for criminal background checks.
- 2) Authorizes the entities to receive criminal history information from the California Department of Justice (DOJ) and the United States Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). (BPC § 144)

This bill:

1) Updates BPC Section 130 to reference the correct name of the Board of Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, and Geologists.

 Updates BPC Section 144 to reference the correct name of the California Board of Naturopathic Medicine.

Background

As the names of boards and bureaus are changed and updated, those names need to be updated and reflected in the BPC as well. This allows for the ability to carry out certain functions, including receiving important criminal history information from DOJ and FBI. This bill updates various sections of the BPC in order to reflect the name changes of programs
